

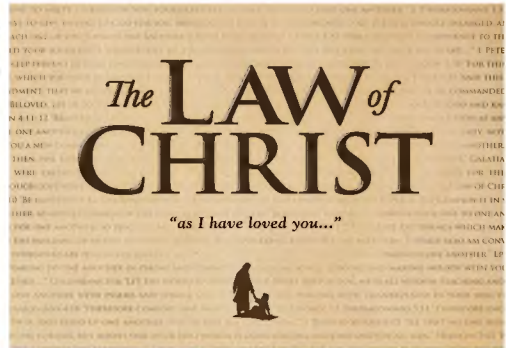
The Law of Christ

Galatians 6:1-5

We have long misunderstood and misapplied this “not under law, but under grace” thing. (cf. Romans 6:15) Some seem to think that means that living in grace means having no spiritual laws above us.

The truth is: many “laws” still are in effect for every Christian.

- The law of love—the greatest commandment.
- The law of the Spirit of life. (Ro. 8:2)
- The law of fidelity in marriage. (1st Cor. 7:39)
The law of expediency. (1st Cor. 6:12; 10:23)
- The perfect law of liberty. (Jms. 1:25)
- The moral law of God (Jms.2:9-11)



The context of this specific “law of Christ” application is in the matter of a believer caught in a fall into sin. Such a happening requires a work of RESTORATION... v.1

1– The actuality of unintentional sin...

2– The attempt to rescue the fallen...

3– The accomplishing of the law of Christ...
